This is a 2-day **practical** course introducing advanced taping techniques. No theory will be reviewed. A basic taping course must be completed in order to attend.

This course **benefit therapists preparing to challenge the SPC exams**, and those who work with athletes in a clinic setting & would like to increase their competency covering sporting events.

The following taping techniques will be reviewed:

1. Sport/injury specific ankle taping.
2. ACL/MCL.
3. Knee De-rotation.
4. Achilles Tendonitis/Strain.
5. AC Separation.
6. Adductor Strain.

Kinesiotape for shoulder dysfunctions will be demonstrated.
